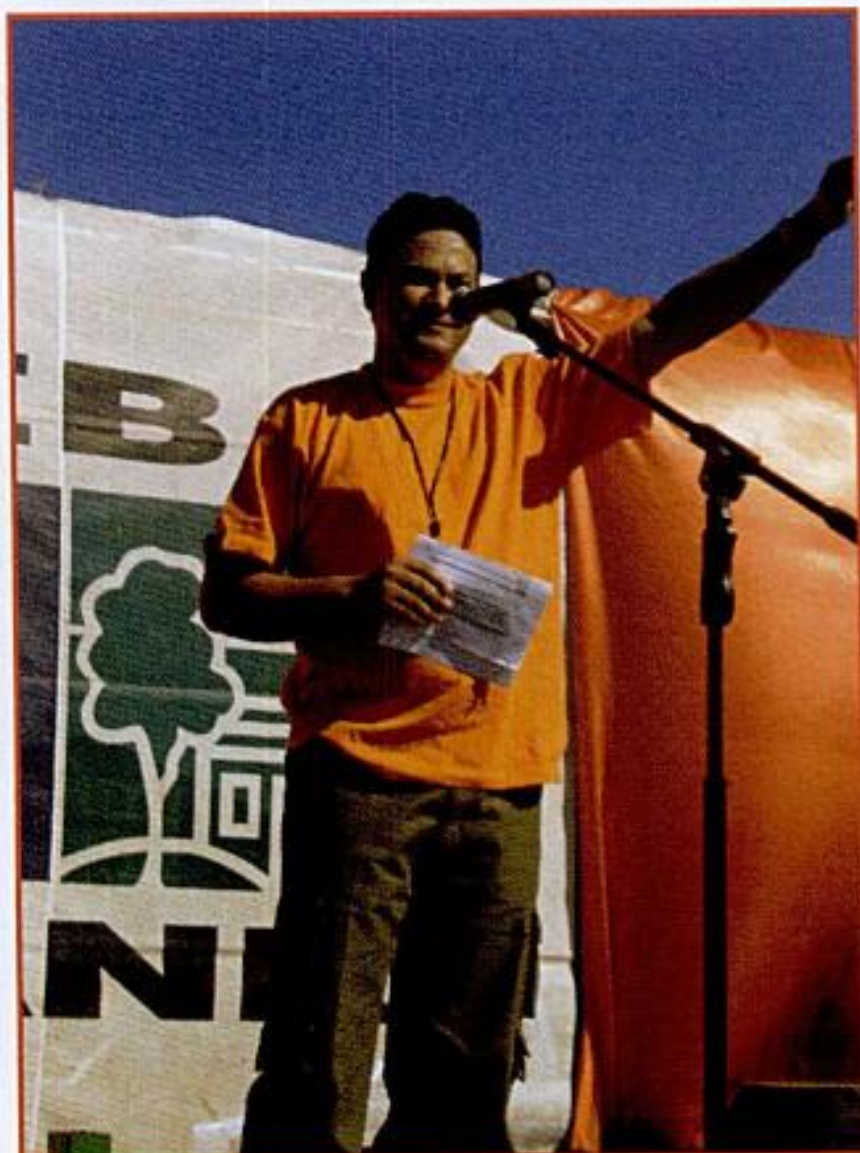


Teba Bank, municipalities partner in sports event

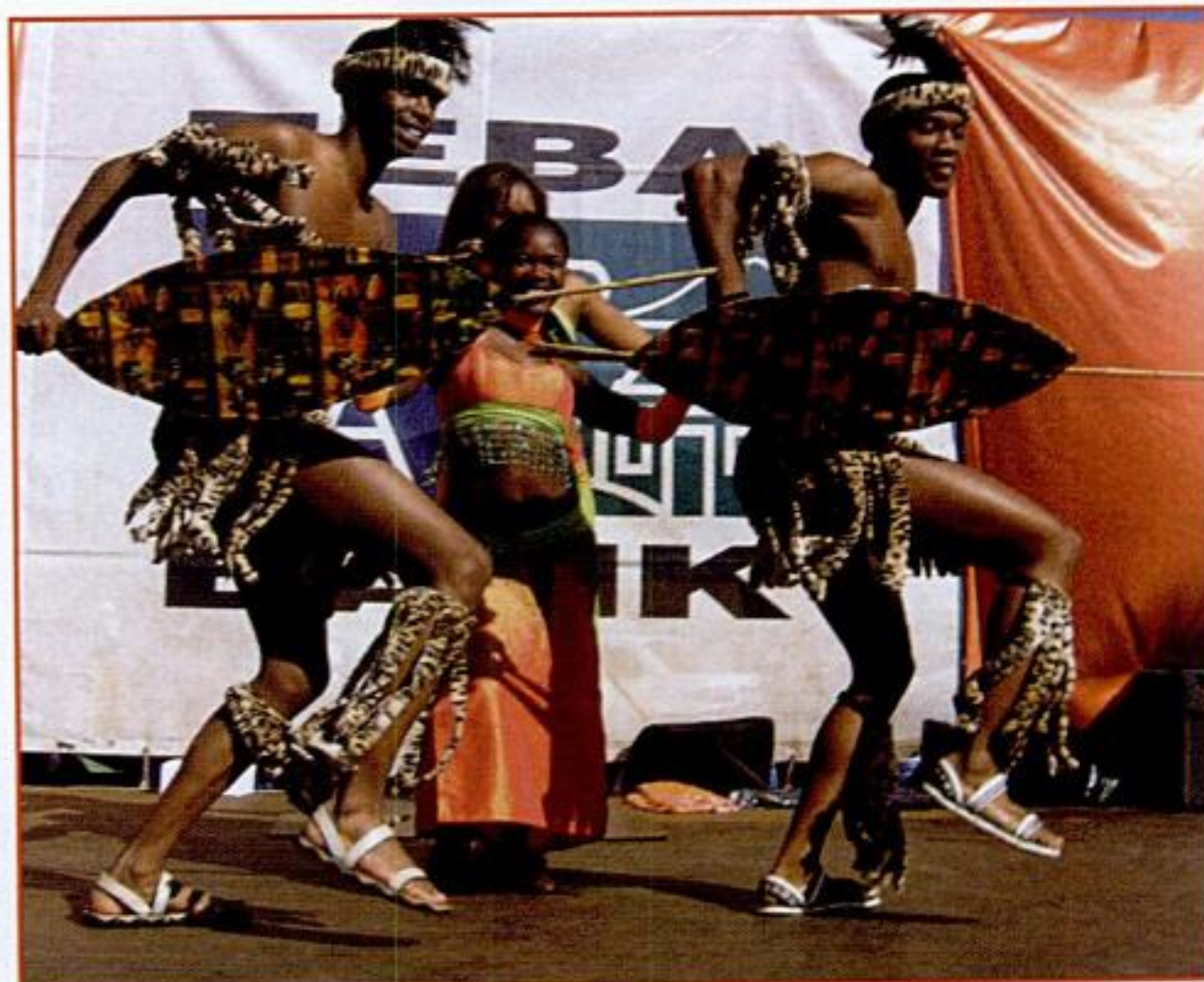
next year!" Mark Williams proclaimed to cheering from the community.
