

'Black Lawyers' Association appoints Ndoni as its first woman president

ANDISWA Ndoni had been appointed president of the Black Lawyers' Association (BLA), the first woman to hold the title, the association announced yesterday. Ndoni has been a member of the BLA's national executive committee for six years and has worked in training and capacity-building for black lawyers.

She founded the Practical Law School in East London and headed the BLA's legal education centre. She was recently also appointed to the executive of Teba Bank.
